Qrp Corner ...

Orp is defined by the Amateur Radio club International as the output power not to exceed five watts.

The saying... "If you can't hear 'em, you can't work 'em" is especially true when working low power operation, but interestingly enough, provides a very good challange to the seasoned as well as the newcomer.

1. Several factors:

a. QRp and low power can be had with inexpensive rigs, no longer need \$1k-\$3k.

b. Equipment manufacturers now amount to several quality kit suppliers, similiar to the good old "heath-kit" days. These suppliers are engineers which design state of the art kits which range from single banders from \$80 to \$150 to quad banders costing \$295 and finally the QRP+ from Index Labs using state of the art microprocessor covering all the bands with digital display for \$595. The equipment makers are listed on the Internet and are gathering steam: Some manufacturers are:

4. Nets:

"... you can't work 'em if you can't hear 'em ..."

a. Knightlite net: -by Paul AA4XX The Knightlites QRP Group invites you to check into our laid back 80 Meter net each Sunday night at 0200 UTC (10PM EDT) on 3710 KHz. The net protocol has evolved over the last few months, with the intention of balancing a reasonable time schedule against the desire to provide an opportunity for each check in to share a few comments with the net. This net is open to all amateurs, running either QRO or QRP.

The protocol is as follows: The Net Control Station sends "CQ KnightLite's Net, QNI K." Stations wishing to check in then send their call ONE TIME, checking-in

in groups. After no more calls are heard, the NCS acknowledges each check in and asks them to wait while the above sequence is repeated three or four times, or until no other check-ins are heard. The NCS then starts at the head of the list, asking for brief comments concerning, rig, power, antenna, etc. Additional stations may feel free to check in during any pauses that are intentionally provided by the NCS. The NCS will also periodically call for additional check ins during the Roundtable part of the net session. This revolving door approach maintains flow and ensures that new stations have ample opportunity to check in as the net progresses.

The nets often go on for 45 minutes or more, but HEY, our purpose is to promote the fun of operating and to encourage as many folks as possible to join in the fun-not to strive for strict time management. Those who can't stick around for the duration are free to check out (QNX) at any time.

Cooking for Hams...

Ham'N Cheddar Broccoli Quiche

1 (15-Oz) pkg. Pillsbury refrigerated Pie Crusts

1 cup milk

4 eggs, slightly beaten

1/4 to 1/2 teaspoon dry mustard

1/8 teaspoon pepper

1 cup cubed, cooked ham

1-1/2 cups shredded cheddar cheese

l cup frozen broccoli cuts, thawed

1 teaspoon chopped onion

Prepare pie crust according to package directions for filled one-crust pie using 9-inch pie pan. (Refrigerate remaining crust for later use). Heat oven to 350'F. In medium bowl, combine milk,eggs,dry mustard and pepper,set aside. Layer ham, cheese, brocolli and onion in pie crust-lined pan. Pour egg mixture over ham, cheese and brocolli. Bake at 350'F. for 40 to 50 minutes or until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Cool 5 minutes; cut into wedges. Garnish as desired. Refrigerate any
